Additional Performance Summary

- The Long-Term Care Foundation has supported 93 different small businesses (Training schools) and paid out \$4,292,905 in funded trainings
- We have funded Training Allowances (previously called stipends) for 1,139 caregivers totaling \$2,219,318
- All funds were spent, no funds were returned or requested to be returned to the State for our Language Access Pilot program that ran from 2023-2025, this is a program we are continuing to this day with no additional funding.
